Course Number: EECT 2373

Course Title: Case Study III: Adv. VOIP Systems Design

Course Description: This course is complimentary to the VoIP and Advanced VoIP courses integrating, from an applications perspective, voice, video and integrated data over an IP network. Case Study III provides an applications treatment of the fundamental concepts of this growing technology. From an applications and hands-on perspective this course contains an in-depth analysis of VoIP in the enterprise and legacy network including SOHO (Small Office Home Office). Network security considerations relating to VoIP applications are emphasized. The class will conduct case studies to support the curriculum and familiarize the student with VoIP system operations, protocols, procedures, and applications.

Student Learning Outcomes: After completing this course, students will be able to: explain VoIP interface, integration, and integration with legacy telephone networks, create documentation to support a solution to a problem through the case study approach, present a solution to a VoIP case study problem to peers and corporate representatives, implement VoIP solutions for multiple sites utilizing both public and private equipment and technology, simulate advanced Voice over IP (VoIP) applications in the enterprise and home environment, identify some of the challenges VoIP faces in today's networks to demonstrate a good understanding of its capabilities utilizing the case study approach, identify and implement network security considerations relating to VoIP deployment and proliferation.
